KEY PROJECTS

Electrical Corporation of America, an electrical contractor, is finishing out their HQ space at 5200 W. 110th for their move to OP in one of Yellow Freight's former buildings, adding nearly 70 jobs to over 850 existing positions.

FastGrid, now **A.N.S.**, expanded in Overland Park in Southcreek Business Park as demand accelerates for renewable energy and infrastructure work, adding up to 15 engineering positions.

Fiserv, a financial technology services firm announced they will bring 2,000 jobs and \$125 million in investment to 427,000 SF at the Aspiria campus.

Propio Language Services expanded its HQ to 81,500 SF at 4900 College Boulevard in Executive Hills.

Security Benefit, a retirement & financial services provider, is expanding to Aspiria adding 30 new jobs with average salaries of more than \$100,000 a year.

Southwind, a national home services provider, chose Overland Park for its headquarters at the former Waddell & Reed campus, bringing approximately 400 jobs. The move brings new activity to long-vacant space and supports a growing platform that includes You Move Me and MVP home services brands.

BUSINESS ATTRACTION

- Promoted Overland Park to consultants, prospective businesses and commercial brokers in the metro markets of Chicago, Dallas, and New York, as well as locally, in partnership with the Kansas Department of Commerce.
- In partnership with Digital Health KC and KCADC attended the Consumer Electronics Digital Health show to speak with companies about expanding here.
- Participated in the Select USA Forum, exhibiting with the KS Department of Commerce, to attract foreign direct investment.

BUSINESS SUPPORT INITIATIVES

- Participation in City and County Task Forces related to building code updates, Unified Development Ordinance updates and Johnson County Transit.
- Actively participate in the Downtown Overland Park Partnership Board and activities
- Met with 105 Overland Park businesses to establish relationships, understand markets and needs, and provide assistance when requested.
- Participated in local and regional task forces related to World Cup preparation and small business readiness.

TALENT INITIATIVES

Launched All in OP Website and branding – a live, work, play, learn and invest website designed to attract skilled talent to Overland Park.

Hosted Talent Reimagined – a skills-based hiring co-hort designed to help businesses implement a skills-focused approach to hiring and retention.

Student Chamber pitch competition – created for student-owned businesses to receive a cash prize.

College Summer Intern Programming – provided four Overland Park experiences for more than 175 college summer interns across nine companies.

ENTREPRENEURIAL INITIATIVES

- Formalized Small Business Council which meets on a regular basis to provide mentoring, networking and education to small businesses and entrepreneurs.
- Launched SizeUp, a data-driven platform that helps small businesses with market research and business intelligence at no cost, setting them up for success.
- Assisted over 35 early-stage entrepreneurs and supported over 50 businesses through research, data insights, and strategic planning support.

DATA & RESEARCH

World Cup Visiting Country Profiles – to support FIFA World Cup business-readiness planning, including market context, visitor considerations, and relevance for local business operations and communications.

Peer City Benchmarking and Comparative Reports – for Chamber leadership exchanges, highlighting peer-market positioning, competitive advantages, and transferable best practices.

Overland Park Economic and Industry Intelligence – recurring “State of Overland Park” reports with industry-specific analysis, including mergers and acquisitions activity, commercial real estate trends, and implications of proposed City budget decisions.

District and Corridor Economic Impact Analysis – targeted economic impact reports estimating GDP contribution and commercial activity for key Overland Park areas, including the College and Metcalf corridor and Oak Park Mall trade area.

Proprietary Economic Development Project Research and RFI Support – internal, project-specific research to support economic development initiatives, including RFI responses, building and site assessments, and vacancy and absorption estimates.

EDC INVESTOR RELATIONS

- Formalized an annual Work Plan and a results tracking method to provide focus and accountability for our work.
- Curated monthly programming to include economic data, panel discussions centered around digital health, entrepreneurs in OP, Women in Real Estate Development, transportation updates and meeting the new police chief.
- Organized “Policy & Progress” roundtable, a VIP investor event with City of OP officials.

PUBLIC POLICY & BUSINESS ADVOCACY

- Advocated for pro-business policies in Topeka and Washington D.C. through legislative events featuring local businesses and Chamber leadership.
- Met with numerous candidates and sitting legislators to discuss priorities and enhancing our pro-business climate.
- Advocated for the County Economic Research Center and the Enterprise Center in Johnson County to retain funding from Johnson County.
- Supported legislation to consolidate childcare oversight in Kansas with the goal of providing more efficiency and greater access to childcare.
